# COLLECTING LITTER IN OUR NEIGHBORHOOD

During the past years we used to go around the neighborhood with a small group of people to collect litter. Just a few times a year, and not on a regular basis. At the same time, an increasing number of residents started cleaning up the streets on their own.

The proposal is to go for it for one hour on Saturdays: from 11 to 12 AM. We think this coordinated manner is the best way to keep the neighborhood clean. Just a few people per week will be fine. And it doesn't have to be the same group every week; participants are free to rotate.

We will start on Saturday, January 15. Point of departure is the Maredijkhuis, at 11 AM. No need to sign up, just come! After the 15th the cleanup will continue on a weekly basis on Saturdays. Litter grabbers, gloves and garbage bags will be provided.

# IN THE SPOTLIGHT: SOFIE VAN KOPPEN

This time the spotlight is on a young resident of the Maredijk neighbourhood. Her name is Sofie van Koppen, she is 25 and she has been living with her partner on Schoolmeesterpad for more than a year. Sofie grew up in Prinsenbeek, a small village near Breda. To further continue her education she moved to Leiden, where she studied biology and medical laboratory research at the Hogeschool, the University of Applied Sciences Leiden. She subsequently did a premaster's and will go on to do a master's in biomedical science.



Leiden has been proclaimed European City of Science in 2022 and Sofie would like to participate in whatever way possible. Sofie: "At the moment I am not part of the organization, but they know me because I've already shown my face everywhere. I'm especially interested in the medical topics because that's where my expertise lies. But I will also happily take part in any other interesting topic." Through her study Sofie came into contact with Lucien Geelhoed, who gave a talk about City of Science at the university. "I immediately stepped up to him and told him that I was really interested and wanted to become actively involved. I have also approached the Leiden 2022 contact person in charge of medical topics emanating from the LUMC, Leiden University Medical Center, and have been in touch with the board of the neighbourhood association to ask if they would like to take part in this project. The idea is that in the course of 2022 people become aware that underlying everything in daily life, there is science."

There are plenty of ideas that can be carried out in the neighbourhood.

Through the neighbourhood newsletter Sofie wants to recruit people for a working group, which will further develop and implement these ideas. Regarding the neighbourhood, Sofie comments: "The first time I got the newsletter it gave me a real kick. I've also noticed that this neighbourhood is very different from other neighbourhoods in Leiden. People greet you in the street and everything is very easy-going. At the same time I'm also glad there are a lot of students in my block of flats so I don't feel like an outsider." Sofie and the other residents of Schoolmeesterpad are busy setting up a WhatsApp group to strengthen the contacts between them and this has generated quite a bit of interest.

When asked what she likes in the neighbourhood, Sofie answers: "I like the fact that in quite a few places in the neighbourhood nature is pretty wild and that nature is allowed to run free. I also think it would be fun to go to a neighbourhood party and meal. My life motto is: "Jump into the deep and swim. You'll always surface and if you don't succeed you will at least have tried."

There are two books on the agenda. 'Ik lach om niet te huilen' ('I laugh so as not to cry') from Lex Kroon, is a novel that appeared as early as 1984. But the book recently got new attention due to the writer Özcan Akyol ('Eus'), since the novel inspired him to become a writer himself. 'Ik lach om niet te huilen', is a raw story, brutal and openhearted, in which the main character ends up as a cocaine sniffing subcontractor.

The second book is 'De Belofte', a Dutch translation of 'The Promise', the newest book by the South-African author Damon Galgut which brought hum the British Booker Prize this year. 'The Promise' tells the history of a white farmers family. This family makes a promise to their black housekeeper. After years of loyal service, she is promised a house and a piece of land in the future. But does the family stick to their promise?
