August-September 2022: Pavement and bicycle lane October-November 2022: Southern car lane November-December 2022: Median strip


October-December 2022: Crossing with Dellaertweg March 2023: Vegetation, street surface, finishing touches

IN THE SPOTLIGHT: YVONNE DONDERS

In the spotlight this time is Yvonne Donders. She may well be the woman who has lived in the Maredijk neighbourhood the longest. Already 74 years. And you really cannot miss her, she catches the eye. In a very nice way. She loves colours and uses them in her hair

blue, purple. And it always looks smart and colourful.

Yvonne was born in the Aloëlaan and has lived there for most of her life. Her parents and grandparents also lived there. When she married she went to live with her parents-in-law in the Marislaan for three years. "Later on my mother lived on her own and that's why we came to live here. She then bought the house next door so that was really great. Both my children were born here. They now live in Alphen because the houses there were somewhat more affordable." Yvonne is still very happy living in the neighbourhood, although much has changed. Before there were lots of children in the neighbourhood. They all played outside and went to the Singel school together. There was a lot more happening on the street. And on every street corner there was a shop, from greengrocer to haberdasher. They have all gone. The people in the Maredijk neighbourhood were also a lot more mixed. "But the neighbourhood in itself is still really great, it's a very good place to live. I still like it here tremendously and everyone is friendly, the young ones as well. I wouldn't know a nicer neighbourhood."



I didn't want to throw in the towel and went to the Breestraat to the temp agency and there I found Dress for Success (see box). I've been working there now for more than eleven years and soon they will have existed twelve-and-a-half years. I am now the shop coordinator, I receive the applications and make the appointments. Besides that I do workshops and other jobs that come up. We have a total of ten volunteers and it is a very social and close-knit team that has been working together for a long time. "Respect each other in the neighbourhood, pay attention to each other and accept things from one another. Putting things in

perspective gets you furthest. Be happy that you can still do things and enjoy it": wise words which Yvonne would like to give to the neighbourhood by way of conclusion.

And we (the editors) are curious if you know someone who has lived in our neighbourhood even longer than Yvonne.

Dress for Success is a foundation which helps people with limited means. If they have a job interview and lack a set of suitable clothes they can be referred, usually by the municipality, to the Dress for Success shop, where they will be fitted with an appropriate outfit. The clothing is donated by private persons, donations and clothes shops. The customers also receive tips for the interview or follow a workshop. HELP FOR UKRAINE

A good friend of ours in Poland, Bronek Slezak, has started a relief action. With a group of volunteers they drive minibusses to Ukraine to bring relief supplies, such as food, medical aid and clothing, which they have collected themselves. On the return trip they take refugees, usually women and children who have been stranded and do not have their own transport. In this way they

have now brought a large group of people to safety. They go deep into the countryside and the circumstances they encounter are sometimes horrendous. That's why Bronek is determined to continue as long as circumstances permit. The transports are financed with own means and through private donations from Poland, the Netherlands and the United States. We have organised a fund-raising drive here to give Bronek financial support. Donations are spent entirely on fuel and relief supplies which they buy in Poland.

The book we will discuss this time is 'In het huis van de dichter', by the writer/journalist Jan Brokken. He is one of the most well known Dutch writers. His career started at the weekly journal HP/De Tijd and he has since then grown to a great writer. Countless books were created by him: novels, travelogues and literary non-fiction. In the early eighties, Brokken met the Russian pianist Youri Egorov. Egorov had fled from the Soviet-Union shortly before. A friendship grew between the author and the pianist. 'In het huis van de dichter' is a portet of Egorov, the tormented pianist that celebrated his triomphs with his subtle plays, but who would perish tragically in Amsterdam in the

Rental of homes for tourist purposes

On the 27th of January, the policy document concerning the rental of homes for tourist purposes was discussed in the city council.

In short, rental of homes is allowed under the following conditions

- The landlord must register once
- The registration number must be mentioned at rental platforms
- A maximum of 30 nights per year.
- Supervision of complaints

Despite the participation and input, the current law holder, Yvonne van Delft, has sent the policy document to the city council unchanged. A more active enforcement policy was suggested, but she suggested this policy is already a huge improvement compared to the old situation. More enforcement is not necessary according to her. She expects that the current, illegal offerings on Airbnb (which is indeed forbidden at this time) will decrease quickly after the introduction of this new policy. She admits this mostly rests on the trust in our fellow people. The city council has accepted the policy.

Thus, we will have to continue reporting nuisances.

General meeting


