EEFJES SINGELPARK

In September a very special children's book was presented to the city of Leiden: Eefjes Singelpark (Eefje's City Moat Park). The book is situated in Singelpark. The stories offer walking routes to (and through) 15 of the parks that are part of the larger Singelpark surrounding Leiden's Old Town. And what makes the book extra special is that the circular walk starts and ends in our very own Maredijkbuurt.

Eefje, a Dutch girl of 6 years old, is very curious. From her father she wants to know everything about the trees in the park, and this is how the reader learns the names of the beautiful, large, old trees in Singelpark, and what makes them so interesting.

However, the book is more than just an inspiration for a number of city walks. It also expresses wonder about the ingenious way of life of trees in general. The book was written for families with children aged 5 to 9, but is just as interesting for grandmothers and grandfathers. In fact, it is interesting for everyone who likes to wander through parks and observe the surroundings with the openness and curiosity of a child.

Authors Germaine Kurstjens (text; she's a resident of our neighborhood) and Judith Sebregts (illustrations) hope that everyone reading the book will enjoy Singelpark as much as Eefje does!

"IN THE SPOTLIGHT: DIK TOET

Just outside the Maredijk neighbourhood, in Leiden North, Dik Toet lives with his wife Janneke Koers, in a beautiful bright apartment with wide views and a splashing fountain in front of the door. They have never regretted their move, not for a moment. The apartment is new and requires no maintenance, like their old house on Maredijk where there was always something to fix. And they don't have to miss the neighbourhood, because they are still members, Janneke is



secretary of the playground association, and Dik still active in the choir and the walking group. So the reason for this interview is not at all that he has left the neighbourhood (what your journalist thought), but the fact that the sound barrier on Willem de Zwijgerlaan for which he has worked for years is finally there. Bit cynical that he no longer benefits from it himself, but that's how these things go. And it really makes a difference in the noise, Dik notices as he walks past. Dik is from The Hague, studied in Leiden, and came to live in the Maredijk neighbourhood in 2004 with his current wife Janneke at the end of Maredijk. He has been retired since 2014 and has devoted much of his time to the neighbourhood's activities committee. He worked for the municipality of Leiden and, among other things, stood at the cradle of the regional municipal cooperation body, in which municipalities act together on traffic, spatial planning and the like. It was also considered important in municipal politics that citizens take initiatives themselves, help each other and together ensure a liveable and pleasant neighbourhood. Dik also wanted to experience this from the other side, so he resolved to give the neighbourhood a bit of a nice shake-up. He never served on the association board, precisely because he enjoyed doing things and organizing activities more. Boards he has already done enough. Together with Christa he founded the activities committee, and soon there was an active group of loyal residents who organized all sorts of things. By now many more people are active in the neighbourhood, so you could say that they have succeeded well: the choir, diner on the Maredijk, the community garden, Saturday pickings, the façade gardens, the playground,

the creation of the neighbourhood bench, Ruud on Sunday (unfortunately not yet followed up), the neighbourhood newspaper and the website: imagine that in other neighbourhoods! That's actually the main difference with where he lives now: he has no idea who his neighbours are (except for Mart Hoogkamer, the next-door neighbour, so there you have it!), despite some attempts on his part to get better acquainted. It didn't get any further than that. Dik co-wrote the Neighbourhood Vision and says his enthusiasm was totally sparked by Fonds 1818's Autumn Grant, in which - as a surprise - the grand prize of 10,000€ went to the Maredijk Neighbourhood Association. Dik is not only active in the neighbourhood association, but also on all sorts of other fronts: behind the bar at the Lumen drop-in centre (for and by people with psychiatric backgrounds), employee of Eigenkracht (organizing family conferences in case of problems),



volunteer at the Voice of Leiden (writing down the life stories of ordinary Leiden residents), one of the initiators of the Citizens' Consultation on Climate (advice from citizens to politicians). The red line that he himself sees in all these activities is that he is a social person (now we call that a "connector"), but especially

that he is committed to letting people use their own strengths, whether they are people with psychiatric problems or citizens who want a say in their neighbourhood. The fact that he is politically active in the Green Left therefore comes as no surprise. One more advice he wants to give the current board. It is good that the Maredijkbuurt itself also actively organizes participation (such as about The Schipholweg). It helps that a neighbourhood association does not just grumble and whine, but takes a constructively critical stance. The municipal sometimes likes that too, and it can help keep relations good (for example, Dik once appeared at a council committee meeting to compliment them: they fell off their chairs and didn't believe that was the only thing he came for). More housing is needed, of course, and more in the city is ultimately better than building in the polder, but that can be done in many ways, and then it is nice when residents, as experts by experience, can contribute their objections or, on the contrary, compliments. On behalf of the neighbourhood, I congratulate Dik on his sound barrier and encourage him to walk past it often on his way to the Maredijk neighbourhood.

Reading Club

On Saturday, February 18, 2023, the Maredijk Neighbourhood Reading Club will meet again. This time we will meet at Sigrid Jansen's house, Marislaan 59. We start at 2 p.m. There is one book on the program this time. We have chosen Spijkerschrift by Kader Abdolah. Spijkerschrift was published in 2011 and almost immediately became a great success. Kader Abdolah is no stranger to Dutch literature. Born in Iran in 1954, this writer fled to the Netherlands in the late 1980s. In a short time he managed to master Dutch. His command of Dutch is now as good as his mother tongue Farsi. He was able to realize his dream of becoming a writer in the Netherlands. In Spijkerschrift Kader Abdolah tells the story of a deaf-mute father and his son. Aga Akhbar, the father, wrote a book in his self-developed cuneiform during his lifetime. After his death, his son Ismaiel, who fled to Holland, receives the book. The son tries to make the book readable, just as he tried to make his father intelligible during his childhood in Iran. 
